

with Dr. Brad Strawn—An Apprentice to Self-Emptying Love

Sermon Text:

Philippians 2: 1-11 CFB

Therefore, if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort in love, any sharing in the Spirit, any sympathy, complete my joy by thinking the same way, having the same love, being united, and agreeing with each other. Don't do anything for selfish purposes, but with humility think of others as better than yourselves. Instead of each person watching out for their own good, watch out for what is better for others. Adopt the attitude that was in Christ Jesus:

Though he was in the form of God,

he did not consider being equal with God something to exploit.

But he emptied himself

by taking the form of a slave

and by becoming like human beings.

When he found himself in the form of a human, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death,

even death on a cross.

Therefore, God highly honored him

and gave him a name above all names,

so that at the name of Jesus everyone

in heaven, on earth, and under the earth might bow

and every tongue confess that

Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Deuteronomy 8:1-10 CEB

You must carefully perform all of the commandment that I am commanding you right now so you can live and multiply and enter and take possession of the land that the LORD swore to your ancestors. Remember the long road on which the LORD your God led you during these forty years in the desert so he could humble you, testing you to find out what was in your heart: whether you would keep his commandments or not. He humbled you by making you hungry and then feeding you the manna that neither you nor your ancestors had ever experienced, so he could teach you that people don't live on bread alone. No, they live based on whatever the LORD says. During these forty years, your clothes didn't wear out and your feet didn't swell up. Know then in your heart that the LORD your God has been disciplining you just as a father disciplines his children. Keep the commandments of the LORD your God by walking in his ways and by fearing him, because the LORD your God is bringing you to a wonderful land, a land with streams of water, springs, and wells that gush up in the valleys and on the hills; a land of wheat and barley, vines, fig trees, and pomegranates; a land of olive oil and honey; a land where you will eat food without any shortage—you won't lack a thing there—a land where stone is hard as iron and where you will mine copper from the hills. You will eat, you will be satisfied, and you will bless the LORD your God in the wonderful land that he's given you.

Good Life Challenge: Week 3

To engage in self-emptying love is to have the attitude or mind of Christ. It is to take on the form of a servant for the sake of the other. We live in a world in which we unwittingly engage in a rule of life that teaches us that the goal of life is personal fulfillment. It is all about me, my rights, my privilege, and my way. But the WAY of Jesus is a self-emptying love which means we give up our rights, our privilege and our way. This is only possible because we learn that we have a God who we can trust. A God who will not let us down. A heavenly parent who knows us, cares for us, and will be there for us.

The spiritual practice of fasting is one way in which we learn not only how much we need God but how much God is truly there for us. By fasting from food, behaviors, activities, etc., (often good things of God) we are reminded that we don't need all these things. What we need God will provide. We can trust God, we can hold "our possessions" lightly. When we can live this way, we can practice self-emptying love for the other, the neighbor in our midst. We don't have to worry that there isn't enough to go around, because God is the one that provides.

Examples:

What should I fast? Pray about this. What is something that it often feels like you can't live without? What is a behavior you engage in so automatically you don't even think about it? What is something you do that is almost exclusively for your own self-fulfillment? This might help you find something to fast.

Personal

- Fast a meal once per week (or a whole day) and during that time pray, journal, listen to Christian music, engage in spiritual reading.
- Fast one food item per day or week. For example, don't put sweetener in your tea or coffee.
- Fast a type of behavior: social media, spending money on a particular thing or on a particular day, criticism, sarcasm, watching the news one day a week, rushing, speeding, etc.

Relationships

- . Make a "fast covenant" with a friend in which you fast the same thing and/or pledge to hold each other
- . Meet to talk about what it has been like, what you are learning and why it is hard.

Edify Others and Mission

• If you are fasting something that has a financial price tag, take that money and use it to edify someone else. Make it a part of your weekly offering, donate it to a particular social cause, etc.
