### with Pastor Tara Beth Leach-File This; Trash That

### Sermon Text:

#### Mark 6:30-44 NIV

The apostles gathered around Jesus and reported to him all they had done and taught. Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, "Come with me by vourselves to a quiet place and get some rest."

So they went away by themselves in a boat to a solitary place. But many who saw them leaving recognized them and ran on foot from all the towns and got there ahead of them. When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he began teaching them many things.

By this time it was late in the day, so his disciples came to him. "This is a remote place," they said, "and it's already very late. Send the people away so that they can go to the surrounding countryside and villages and buy themselves something to eat."

But he answered, "You give them something to eat."

They said to him, "That would take more than half a year's wages! Are we to go and spend that much on bread and give it to them to eat?'

"How many loaves do you have?" he asked. "Go and see."

When they found out, they said, "Five-and two fish."

Then Jesus directed them to have all the people sit down in groups on the green grass. So they sat down in groups of hundreds and fifties. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to his disciples to distribute to the people. He also divided the two fish among them all. They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces of bread and fish. The number of the men who had eaten was five thousand.

### Good Life Challenge: Week 5

Our lives are full of beautiful moments of joy; crisp morning walks, falling leaves, the crackle of a fresh log on the fireplace. Sometimes these moments go unnoticed. In the hustle and bustle of daily living, sometimes these moments are hurried past; just specks as we travel from one place to another. It is so easy to miss these opportunities for joy and reflection, easy to move on from them with little to no thought. As we've been practicing the art of pausing, the practice of gratitude become essential.

Sometimes, we can treat Eucharist like this, a small speck of a moment between the sermon on Sunday and Sunday lunch. We hurry to pass the elements and move right past a significant communal moment.

Roots

"And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them ... "(Luke 22:19 NIV).

In the original language of the scripture text the phrase, 'gave thanks' is translated eucharisteo. "The root word of eucharisteo is charis, meaning 'grace.' Jesus took the bread and saw it as grace and gave thanks. He took the bread and knew it to be a gift and gave thanks ... euCHARisteo - the table of thanksgiving" (Ann Voskamp, One Thousand Gifts).

#### This Weeks Challenge:

Instead of hurrying past small meaningful moments, name them. Don't let the opportunity for joy expressed through gratitude to elude you. Don't hurry past Eucharist today in service, don't skip over that small spark of light, and don't trade a posture of gratitude for the oh-so-easy to apply posture of negativity or assuming the work.

### Ideas for Incorporating Gratitude Into Your Rule of Life

- Grab a journal and start collecting your gratitude moments by writing each moment down.
- Use some sticky notes and a jar. Write one moment on a note and place it in the jar each night.
- Dig deeper and read Ann Voskamp's book. One Thousand Gifts.
- Take Eucharist with your community as an act of worship and thanksgiving.
